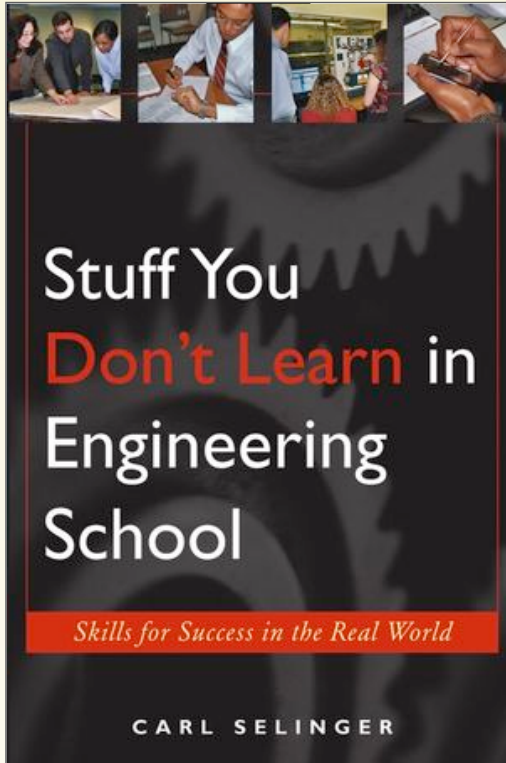

Carl Selinger (Keynote) - Consultant
